**PUTTING DOWN THE SPEED BUMPS**----- Dean and Hugh Newman were busy Wednesday morning drilling holes into the pavement on Trails End in Paradise to secure the first of two new \$6,000 speed bumps that will be installed there. The moveable speed bumps will be on this street for a while and then moved again to another spot in Paradise that has a bad reputation for speeding drivers. The holes they're drilling for the hardware to secure the speed bumps will stay in place and when, and if, the Town has to, they can put the bumps back into position in the future. These two workers with the Town of Paradise are not only colleagues, they're also brothers.

## Walk Across Canada

Michelle Aubie is a self professed free spirit whose dogged determination is to shine light on the plight of those suffering from Crohn's disease. She's going to do it by walking 30 kilometres a day for the next 12 months to hopefully raise some awareness and \$100,000 for the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation.

"I was inspired to do the walk, to raise awareness of the illness because so many people have it. It should be as common knowledge as Cancer or Heart Disease," says Aubie, who learned she had the illness only about a year ago. She says before she became afflicted, she had no idea just how widespread the disease really was.

Crohn's Disease is a chronic inflammatory bowel disease, (or IBD) that results in the swelling and inflammation of the digestive tract. There is no known cause, or cure and it affects over 200,000 Canadians. That's one for every 200 people in Canada.

On Monday May 4th, Aubie and her male companion, Pierre Luc - DesRoches, both of Bathurst, New Brunswick, set out from the most easterly point in North America, in Cape Spear, Newfoundland. They were supposed to begin their journey on May 1st but because of delays with the Marine Atlantic ferry coming to Newfoundland, her plans were slightly set back.

Her friend Pierre will only be accompanying her for the Atlantic portion of the trek, after that she'll continue on her own journey that will take her over hills, through big cities and small towns, across bridges, highways, prairies and mountains all by herself. It's an approximate 7795-km expedition that will take her all the way to Victoria, British Columbia and it's sure to have its ups, and a fair share of downs along the way, as she's already found out.

She has a small yellow pup tent as living quarters and everything else she'll need for the year-long journey in a

back pack that when fully loaded weighs 45lbs. She's very excited about it all and with regular calls from her mom every night, she's pumped for the trip of a lifetime.

Day two of her long walk across Canada, and she's approximately 60kms from her starting point, at the home of Wilf and Ann Marie Furey, in Holyrood. She pitched her tent in

## No smoking at CBS facilities

You can forget about taking a puff at any CBS recreational facilities from now on, including the outdoors ones.

CBS Council has adopted a comprehensive policy which bans smoking at all town owned recreational facilities including sports fields, playgrounds and entrances to both indoor and outdoor recreational facilities.

However it is OK to light up on the parking lots of those facilities as long as you are 10 metres away from all doors, entryways and walkways.

While support for the ban was unanimous around the council table, Councillor John Hicks was less than impressed. "What we are doing is lip service. I don't think it is enforceable, I wish it was, but I do not see how we can force the ban."

Deputy Mayor Paul Davis said the decision is town policy, it is not a bylaw while Mayor Woodrow French said that peer pressure would make the policy work and would provide the enforcement.

Councillor Gerard Tilley asked that all user groups be issued with a copy of the policy so they could inform their members and supporters.

## More development approved in Paradise

At Tuesday night's public Town council meeting in Paradise several permits were approved.

The first was from BMT Fleet Technology on behalf of Clearview Investments Ltd for 51-lot residential sub division in the area of Adam's Pond. The application complied with the Town's regulations and was recommended for approval.

Another permit was heard from Paradise Properties Ltd for a 7-lot sub division which is part of the Elizabeth Park development. It was recommended for and received approval.

The final permit was from Ellswood Estates Ltd for a 69-lot residential sub division. This is phase two of the Thomas Estates development west of St. Thomas Line and south of the Meadow Heights development. Approval was recommended by the Town Planner and was granted by council.

## Council to repair flooded areas

CBS Council has voted to repair thirteen separate roads that have been experiencing flooding.

They will spend almost \$136,000 of their own capital works money plus some of the Multi Year Capital Works money to do the repairs.

The roads to be repaired include; Mercer's Road, Heritage Road, Rideout's Road, Sheridan Avenue, Butler's Road North, Dunn's Hill Road, Dicks Place, Monument Road, Emma's Place, Daniels Road, Tilley's Road South, Jerathon Place and Red Bridge Road.

Work has already started on the repairs.
